Staff at Summitview spent the last two weeks in September conducting our first round of goal setting meetings with parents and students. We enjoyed the opportunity to meet parents, and to jointly set goals for the first report card.



All students in our school have now completed their yearly Canadian Achievement Tests. Once the results arrive, staff will decide which academic areas require extra attention, and will develop strategies to focus on areas of need.

Students in Grade 6 are embarking on a year-long study of Canada's democratic system of government in the hope that it will inspire them to become active, engaged, informed and responsible citizens. Recently, students had the opportunity to work in small groups to create an Oath of Citizenship for the students of Summitview School. Each group created five "laws" that students must follow, five duties that students should be responsible for and an oath to which all students should affirm.
